EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Executive Director Booth informed the Board that there were no violations this month. There were two water main breaks since our last meeting. The first was repaired inhouse with the assistance of our third party vendor. The other was on Fox Chase & Westerly Drives where we repaired street valves which was also repaired in-house. There were ten discolored water complaints. Most were caused by customer internal plumbing maintenance and a few by road construction in the area. There were a few phone calls yesterday, August 1, 2023, concerning discolored water which was due to a contractor changing out valves at a hydrant for the Authority. This has been resolved.

Executive Director Booth advised the Board that in the near future, the Authority will be working with the NJ DEP, Rutgers University and the Stevens Institute on a PFAS study at our Elmwood WWTP. They are going to work on the numbers of PFAS that are going through our waste stream.

Executive Director Booth advised that the MUA participated in National Night Out on Tuesday, August 1, 2023. He expressed appreciation to the Evesham Township Police Department for inviting us. The Authority provided 1,200 bottles of water to attendees.

Executive Director Booth announced the retirement of Jim Lynch. He expressed appreciation to Jim for his 26 years of service and wished him well on his future endeavors.
